Resilience: the ability to overcome adversity and obstacles in order to succeed. The mark of a strong team is the ability to remain resilient when factors are stacked against you. On Saturday the Waves climbed to a 4-0 record despite having to succeed in a pool where, historically, the Waves have not performed well. Against a talented Whitehall team, the Waves set five team records, won 31 of 44 individual events and 4 of 5 relays, as their chances of finishing with a perfect 5-0 regular season record improved considerably. Once again the Waves opened the meet with two wins in the 200m Medley Relays, scoring an early 23-15 advantage that grew as the morning wore on. The girls 200m Medley team of Kendall McMillen, Ebony Sherrill, Amelia Tarlton and anchor Kelsey Hare won by over seven seconds while the boys team of Matt Cooke, Zach Stephens, Trey Lutich, and Jamie Hibbert eased into first with a 16 second bulge.

Whitehall had some great performances of their own from swimmers Holly Sampson, Annie Hayburn, triple winner Hannah Van Dress, Vince Conti and Dave Webster. As usual, Whitehall posed a huge threat to the season plans of the Waves, but also as expected they were a great group of parents, swimmers and volunteers that ensured a fun morning for all.

Highlights for the Waves included team records from Andrew Nguyen in the 9-10 25m backstroke, 25m breaststroke, and 50m free; Abby Belote in the 13-14 girls 50m freestyle; and Anthony Nguyen in the 8&under 25m backstroke. Great job Andrew, Abby and Anthony!!

Triple winners for the Waves were Alexander and Andrew Nguyen, Abby Belote, and Susan Duncan. Double winners were Cole Holloman, Ebony Sherrill, Anthony Nguyen, Zack Stephens, and Kendall McMillen. Single winners were Matt Essing, Christian and Austin Fisher, Trey Lutich, Amelia Tarlton, Spencer Gruwell, Carla Arquero, Jamie "FSU" Hibbert, and Logan Hare.

Cole Holloman and Logan Hare battled out the closest finish of the day in the boys 13-14 50m butterfly with Cole coming in at 33.99 and Logan at 34.00. Two hard workers getting the job done for the Waves!

There's never enough room to list all of the seconds, thirds and fourths, but this was another total team victory from every one of our swimmers. We can't do it without each and every one of you. Teamwork wins meets!

Next Saturday, the Waves will go for the perfect finish with a home meet against the Montpelier Marlins, and the Marlins will attempt to defeat the Waves for the fifth straight year. Come early and bring the family! It will be a great one.
